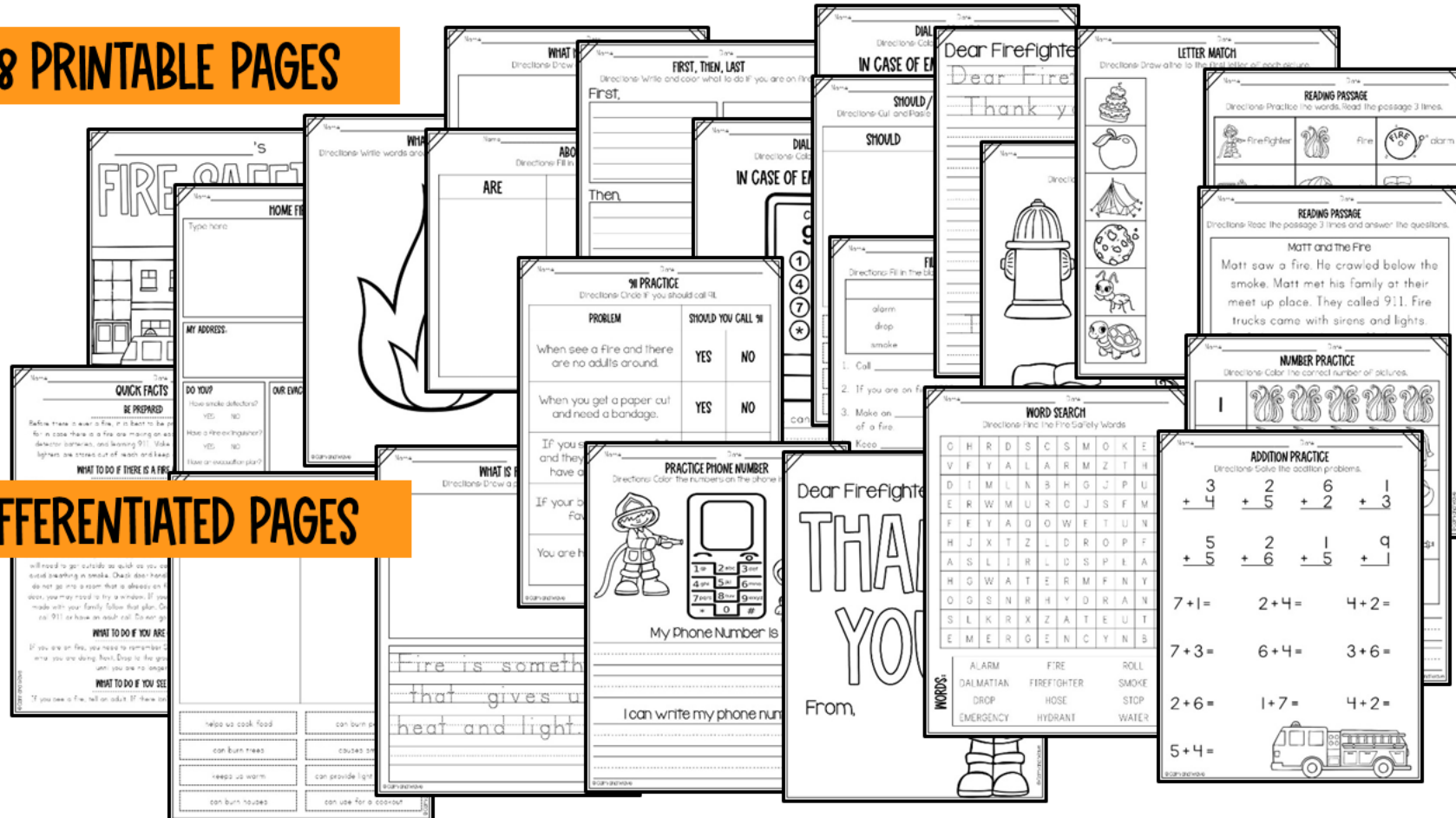

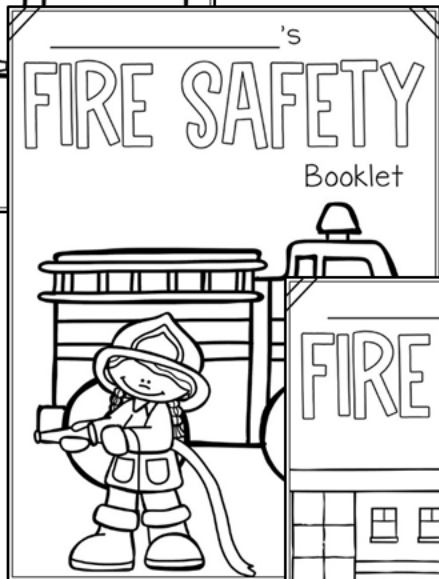
WHAT IS FIRE?

Fire is something that gives us heat and light. It's created when something burns. Fire makes heat, smoke, and flames. It is dangerous and can spread quickly. Have you ever seen a campfire or a lit candle? That's fire.

QUICK FACTS

BE PREPARED

Before there is ever a fire, it is best to be prepared. Some ways to plan for in case there is a fire are making an escape plan, checking smoke detector batteries, and learning 911. Make sure that all matches and lighters are stored out of reach and keep a fire extinguisher handy.

WHAT TO DO IF THERE IS A FIRE AT SCHOOL?

If there is a fire at school, an alarm or bell will sound. Your teacher will guide you outside and away from the fire. It will be scary, but you need to remain calm and quiet. The school will have drills, which are practices, of what to do during a fire. If you see fire at school, immediately find a teacher or other adult and tell them or pull the fire alarm.

WHAT TO DO IF THERE IS A FIRE AT HOME?

If there is a fire at your home, your smoke detector will likely sound. You will need to get outside as quick as you can. Crawl low to the ground to avoid breathing in smoke. Check door handles to see if they are hot and do not go into a room that is already on fire. If you can't make it to a door, you may need to try a window. If you already have an escape plan made with your family follow that plan. Once you are safely out, either call 911 or have an adult call. Do not go back in a burning building.

WHAT TO DO IF YOU ARE ON FIRE?

If you are on fire, you need to remember Stop, Drop and Roll. First Stop what you are doing. Next, Drop to the ground. And finally, Roll around until you are no longer on fire.
