ALL ABOUT MISSOURI



Missouri is the 24th state, it became a state on August 10th, 1821. The name Missouri comes from a Native American word that means "those who dugout canoes". While Missouri doesn't have an official nickname the one most commonly used is the "Show Me State". The state bird is the bluebird. The state flower is the hawthorn and the state tree is the flowering dogwood.

Native Americans, mostly Osage, Missouria, and Quapaw tribes lived in Missouri, before the arrival of European settlers. The first European settlers were mostly French Canadians. They settled in what would be Ste. Genevieve around 1750. The town became a thriving agricultural center. St. Louis was founded soon after and became a trade center thanks to its proximity to the Mississippi River.

In 1803, the Louisiana Purchase was signed adding what would become Missouri to the United States. Shortly after, in 1804, Lewis and Clark set out on their expedition. Their trip ended in 1806 in St. Louis, Missouri. In 1826, Jefferson City was made the capital of Missouri.


During the Civil War, Missouri was divided on whether to stay with the Union or secede and was claimed by both the North and the South. The "Missouri Compromise" allowed Missouri to enter the Union as a slave state and Maine as a free state.

Union Station in St. Louis was opened in 1892, and at the time was the largest train station. Missouri transitioned from mostly rural to a mix of industry, service, and agricultural economy, which continues to this day.



The 1904 World's Fair was held in St. Louis, Missouri. It celebrated the centennial of the Louisiana Purchase. Many scientific and medical discoveries were presented there, such as the wireless telephone and the x-ray machine.



ICE CREAM CONE

Did you know that the ice cream cone was **debuted** at the 1904 World's Fair in St. Louis, Missouri? The story of how the cone came to be is often debated. The most common telling is that an ice cream vendor at the fair ran out of cups to put ice cream in. He noticed the vendor next to him was selling waffles. He took the waffle and shaped it into the cone shape we know today and added a scoop of ice cream on top. It was a hit! In 2008, Missouri named the ice cream cone as its official state dessert.

The history of Missouri is deeply rooted in the cultures and traditions of its first inhabitants, the Osage, Missouri, and Quapaw tribes. These indigenous groups lived harmoniously with the land long before European settlers set foot in the region. The arrival of Europeans marked a new chapter in Missouri's history, with the first settlers, primarily French Canadians, arriving around 1750. They established a settlement known as Ste. Genevieve, which over time, became a thriving agricultural center. The fertile soils of the region provided ideal conditions for farming and livestock rearing, leading to an abundance of produce that needed markets. The Mississippi River played a crucial role in this aspect, serving as a vital conduit for trade. The river allowed for the efficient transport of goods, thereby fostering economic growth and transforming Ste. Genevieve into a buzzing hub of commerce and activity.


